Dear Colleague,

You are aware that the Post Graduate Diploma in Public Health Management (PGDPHM) course conducted by PHFI is supported by Ministry Of Health and Family Welfare under the National Health Mission (NHM). The diploma course is a one year, full residential course aimed at capacity building of Mid-level health functionaries, so as to address the gap in the Public Health Managerial capacity amongst health professionals in the country with reputed partner Institutes.

2. Recognising that the requirement of public health Managers in our public health facilities is a felt need and hence the Ministry has decided to continue support for the course for the financial year 2016-17 @Rs. 2.75 lakh for Government Institutions and Rs. 3.25 Lakhs for Private Institutions. The details of Institutes along with number of seats and a note on the utility of this course for health functionaries is attached as Annexure-I and II respectively.

3. I would earnestly request to nominate and ensure participation of as many suitable officials as possible for the said programme. The State/UT-Governments are expected to treat the nominated officers on duty. To facilitate the timely reporting of nominated candidates as per the Course schedule, approval for this activity has been included in the Ministry's letter D.O. No 10(36)2015-NRHM-I dated 19th February, 2016 (Copy enclosed). From the financial year 2016-17 onwards, nominated candidates have the flexibility to choose from any of the partner Institutes and not merely the one assigned to the State.

4. The selection criteria for Government nominations in PGDPHM are as given below:

a) Candidates working with central, state or local governments with at least three years of experience in health sector. Applicants should be MBBS/BDS/AYUSH graduates or should have passed B. Sc in nursing/health science/natural science or Bachelors of occupational therapy/ physiotherapy or MA in social sciences or an equivalent qualification.

b) Nursing staff, municipal corporation officers and other professionals working in health related organisations may also be considered for nominations.

- c) Upper age limit may be kept as 50 years at the time of applying.
- d) Willingness to serve in Public Health position after successful completion of the course. Candidates likely to be appointed as BMO/DPM/DHO/Dy.CMO/CMHO/ Civil surgeon should be given preference.
- e) No other restriction should be imposed on the applicants except bond to serve in the Government after the course.

Note on importance of training in public health management for health functionaries working at Block, District and State levels under health system

The public health challenges being faced by respective States/ UTs in India call for capacity development at the levels of both, the State/ UTs and Central health systems. The need of the hour is therefore to position qualified professionals who can skilfully plan, execute and monitor national health policies and programmes, supervise the public health workforce, fully assess the dimensions of public health issues and devise appropriate strategies to meet emerging managerial challenges in the health system. It is well understood that for improved population health outcomes, the health officials occupying key positions at Block, District, and State levels should ideally have training in public health management. For effectively conducting National and State health programs, there is a felt need to develop public health managerial capacities among mid level health functionaries in sub cadres such as doctors, nurses, allied health professionals, etc. To address the gap of trained human resource in health systems, in addition to their clinical role, there is requirement to provide appropriate training to these health functionaries towards an administrative and managerial role. The grass root frontline field workers receive appropriate in-service training to supplement their pre-service qualifications. But in the case of mid level health functionaries, such capacity building opportunities in public health are minimal, though they are expected to supervise public health functions of frontline field workers.

It is ascertained that for a substantial public health management capacity enhancement within a short time, State Governments/ UTs need to offer a viable option, which would enable them to train large numbers of in-service health functionaries. In this regard, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India under National Health Mission (NHM) is sponsoring health functionaries across States/ UTs, to attend one year residential Post Graduate Diploma in Public Health Management (PGDPHM), since 2008. The fee of participants nominated by the respective state governments/ UTs for the course is being supported by NHM.

PGDPHM has been specifically developed in alignment with the stated objectives, strategies, and activities of NHM (earlier NRHM) for the training of these mid level health functionaries working in the states/ UTs to efficiently manage public health programme under health systems. The trained public health managers are able to oversee a range of functions ranging from community based disease surveillance, problem solving applications of epidemiologic principles and; participation in programme planning, implementation, monitoring & evaluation, supportive supervision, etc. This capacity generation is critical at all levels of the health system to meet the SDG targets based on primary health care approach.

The PGDPHM program is being conducted by Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI) and other consortium partner institutions including the All India Institute of Hygiene and Public

Health (AIIH&PH) - Kolkata, IIPHS at Gandhinagar, Delhi, Hyderabad, Bhubaneswar, NIHF - New Delhi, JIPMER - Puducherry, PGIMER - Chandigarh, MGIMS - Wardha and IIPHH - Bangalore campus. Some of the state governments have also recognised this P. G. Diploma for promotions on public health positions.

So far, eight batches of PGDPHM participants have already completed the program and have joined their respective states. The States/ UTs have been requested to utilize these health functionaries in Public Health related positions at Block, District and State levels to deal with mainly - planning, program management, monitoring & evaluation, supportive supervision, quality assessment, etc. To ensure this, it is desirable that key positions of officials in managerial and administrative role such as Program Officers at Block, District, Divisional/ Regional and State level are occupied by the health functionaries with Degree/ PG Diploma in Public Health Management.

There is also need to consider various ways of incentivizing and encouraging more and more health functionaries to acquire public health degree/ diploma. The objective is to create a system where adequate incentive is available for doctors and other health functionaries with public health background to occupy key health program positions and add value to the program implementation. There is a need to build the capacities of more number of health professionals in public health to go on a long way in accelerating improvement in public health outcomes.

Dear Secretary,

The process of submission of NHM Programme Implementation Plans (PIP) for the year 2016-17 has begun. Given the underlying resolve to roll out PIP software for PIPs for 2016-17, I commend the States/UTs for putting in extra effort in this direction. We are hopeful that the PIP process would be through the software. However, as a measure of abundant caution, States/UTs have also simultaneously been asked to submit the proposal in excel sheets.

Pending examination of the PIP proposals, as has been the practice, to ensure that there is no disruption in on-going programme/activities, approval is accorded to all States/UTs to continue all on-going activities already approved under NHM on existing rates and terms and conditions in 2015-16. Such activities, inter alia, include on-going programmes/entitlements such as JSSK and JSY, ongoing infrastructure works and works on MCH wings, facility based new born care, implementation of RBSK, provision of free essential drugs, activities of National Mobile Medical Units and National Ambulance Services etc. State/UTs should also continue to provide all the approved performance based incentives to ASHAs and training programmes such as PGDPGM/PDQAC.

States/UTs may also continue the existing HR as per existing approvals, provided the States are keen to continue with them after appraising their performance. However, in cases where approvals for contractual HR were issued specifically till 31st March, 2016 only, States/UTs would not be allowed to continue with such HR unless a specific approval for their confirmation is provided by the Government of India.

States/UTs are requested to ensure that there is no disruption in the ongoing programmes.
